



## SIEA TRADING AS SOLOMON POWER

### NEW CHARGES FOR SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY EFFECTIVE 1 MARCH 2023

In accordance with the **Electricity Act (Cap. 128)** and the **Electricity (Charges for Supply) (No. 3) Regulations 2023**, the electricity tariffs have been reviewed and new rates of charges for the supply of electricity take effect on 1st March 2023.

**Charges:** The rates of charges payable for the supply of electricity on and from 1st March 2023 are as follows:

For March, the Non Fuel Charge increased by an average of 0.7%, Fuel Charge dropped by 7.9% and overall Energy Charges decreased by 3.5% comparing to February. Fall in the overall Energy Charges is due to decreases in Imported Fuel prices.
