## NEW CHARGES FOR SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY EFFECTIVE 1 MAY 2023

In accordance with the Electricity Act (Cap. 128) and the Electricity (Charges for Supply) (No. 5) Regulations 2023, the electricity tariffs have been reviewed and new rates of charges for the supply of electricity take effect on 1st May 2023.
