



# SIEA TRADING AS SOLOMON POWER

## NEW CHARGES FOR SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY EFFECTIVE 1 MAY 2023

In accordance with the **Electricity Act (Cap. 128)** and the **Electricity (Charges for Supply) (No. 5) Regulations 2023**, the electricity tariffs have been reviewed and new rates of charges for the supply of electricity take effect on 1st May 2023.

**Charges:** The rates of charges payable for the supply of electricity on and from 1st May 2023 are as follows:

For May, the Non Fuel Charge increased by an average of 0.5% while the Fuel Charge decreased by an average of 26.1%. The overall Energy Charges went down by 12.3% comparing to April and is due to reduction in Imported Fuel prices.
