



# SIEA TRADING AS SOLOMON POWER

## NEW CHARGES FOR SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY EFFECTIVE 1 MAY 2025

In accordance with the **Electricity Act (Cap. 128)** and the **Electricity (Charges for Supply) Regulations 2025**, the electricity tariffs have been reviewed and new rates of charges for the supply of electricity take effect on 1st May 2025.

**Charges:** The rates of charges payable for the supply of electricity on and from 1st May 2025 are as follows:

For May, the Non Fuel Charge increased by an average of 0.2% compared to April, while Fuel Charge decreased by an average of 9.1% respectively . The overall Energy Charges decreased by 4.6% compared to April and is due to decrease in Imported Fuel Prices.
